REPORT ON DRAINAGE BORING. BROADVIEW GARDENS FOR

WAR SERVICE HOMES DIVISION.

INTRODUCTION.

Following representations from the War Service Homes
Division, arrangements were made to drill a series of drainage
bores in selected allotments at Broadview Gardens, in an attempt
to dispose of surface drainage, and rainwater, which had been
collecting under buildings, and causing serious damp conditions.

DRILLING OPERATIONS.

Drilling operations commenced on 20/8/53, with Driller Little using Plant No. 10, a scout plant.

Two bores were completed for a total depth of 84°, and drilling was discontinued on 26/8/53.

The programme originally called for three test holes; however, due to the limited financial allocation, the project was curtailed.

Bore No. 1 was stopped on instructions at a depth of 30 feet, before penetrating the sandstone horizon, where it was hoped drainage would be obtained.

Bore No. 2 was drilled to a depth of 54; from 49' to 54' the strata was such that possibly satisfactory drainage could have been obtained.

Because no further finance was forthcoming, the plant was returned to the Works Depot, without a drainage test being conducted.

CONCLUSIONS.
