EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

This annual compliance report covers the reporting period 1 January to 31 December 2014 for mining and ancillary operations in the Iron Knob Mining Area (IKMA).

The PEPR 2013/001, approved on the 30 January 2013, enabled recommencement of mining of the existing Iron Monarch pit. PEPR 2013/001 was superseded by PEPR 2014/038 which was conditionally approved on the 15 May 2014.

Subsequent to approval of PEPR2014/038, DMITRE* required Arrium Mining to undertake an audit of capabilities and systems to ensure public safety prior to commencement of operations around the Iron Princess pits and then demonstrate the implementation of those systems once operations at the Iron Princess pits had commenced. DMITRE also required Arrium Mining to review the approved PEPR to include a leading measurement criterion relating to the outcome of public safety.

Operations within the IKMA in 2014 predominantly consisted of mining ore from an area of the Iron Monarch pit known as the 'slot', stripping overburden and commencement of mining ore from the Princess West pit and the construction of the Western Bund. In addition, some resource definition exploration drilling continued within the mining tenements.


The crushing and screening plant was constructed during the latter part of 2014. Production commenced in early March 2015 and the first consignment of ore was consigned to Whyalla by train

on 20 March 2015.

Users of the National Highway 1 have been successfully and safely diverted along the alternate route without delays or inconvenience when blasts have occurred in the Princess West pit close to the highway.

Alterations have been completed at the Iron Knob cemetery, the lookout and the golf club that allows safe and easy access for visitors and members.

*On the 1 of July 2014 DMITRE merged with DFEEST to become DSD (Department of State Development).




Figure 1 **IKMA** tenements




Figure 2 **Current LOM material movements by region**




Figure 3 IKMA exploration drilling program (2013 to 2014)




Figure 4 IKMA current site layout design




Figure 5 IKMA final concept rehabilitation plan



3.4 **Processing method**

3.4.1 **Processing plant**

No processing facilities currently operate within the IKMA.

3.4.2 ROM pad/s

The existing crushing and screening pad and ROM stockpiles are located south-west of the Iron Monarch pit (see Figure 4). The ROM pad will service all pits (i.e. Iron Monarch and Iron Princess East and West) and is constructed from waste and low grade stockpiled material.

3.4.3 Crushing and screening

The crushing and screening facilities have been constructed in the region south-west of the Iron Monarch pit, as shown on Figure 4.

3.4.4 **Product transport**

Product is transported out of the IKMA via the rail link at the southern extents of the mine site. At normal run rates, there will be three to four trains per day. Rail operations re-commenced in March 2015.

There is potential for supplementary trucking operations to be in effect from time to time through the site's alternative southern access/haul route. Trucking operations will be raised and approvals sought if required, after consultation with the community of Iron Knob, DSD, the EPA and the Department of Planning, Transport and Infrastructure (DPTI).

3.5 Operating Hours

3.5.1 Modes and hours of operation

The IKMA operates on a continuous 24 hours a day/seven days a week basis with two 12 hour shifts every 24 hours.

3.6 **Tailings and Waste Rock**

3.6.1 **Tailings Storage Facility**

There are no tailings storage facilities planned for the IKMA.

3.6.2 **Waste Rock Storage**

Waste rock dumps (WRDs) will be designed and managed in accordance with the strategy set out in PEPR2014/038 (see Figure 4 and Figure 5 for locations of WRDs).

The designs have been discussed at Iron Knob community meetings where it was confirmed that the WRD designs should minimise the impact of noise and dust on the township and that the existing WRDs to the north-east and south-east of the Iron Monarch pit should remain as historical monuments. The inclusion of operation bund wall screens as barriers and acceptable final landforms have been key factors underpinning community support for the designs.



3.7 **Electrical consumption and power source**

Electricity at IKMA is sourced from the existing 33 kV overhead transmission line located adjacent to the IKMA operations to the south of the Iron Knob Township.

The estimated power usage will be up to 3.2 MW, averaging approximately 2.5 MW.

3.8 Water Usage

Water usage at IKMA:

an estimated 10–15 m³/h of potable water will be drawn from the SA Water supply for ancillary operations (including crushing and screening dust suppression and train sprays).

The low end of the estimated range will apply during winter months and the upper end during the summer months.

IKMA will use the highly saline pit water for haul road and open area dust suppression.

3.9 Accommodation

There are no camp facilities in the IKMA. Accommodation is predominately provided by the city of Whyalla, with limited accommodation also available in Iron Knob.

Environmental Research Information 3.10

Arrium Mining are sponsoring a PhD study into the range, status and preferred habitat of the Sandhill Dunnart within the Ironstone Hill Conservation Park adjacent to the South Middleback Ranges. The PhD research document will become available in late 2014 or on completion.

3.11 **Community and Wider Environment Support Activities**

3.11.1 Community sponsorship and support

Arrium Mining and its employees support regional and local activities by providing education and sponsorships through to charity fundraising events, all of which require personal commitment and the dedication of individuals.

Arrium Mining's Community Support Program continues to assist communities by supporting ongoing and sustainable initiatives that provide:

- · welfare help for the less advantaged
- local youth with a range of opportunities to assist in their development for the future
- significant benefit to local communities usually in the way of major events or new or improved community facilities.

3.11.2 **Local Employment Opportunities**

Arrium Mining is supportive of Walga Mining, an aboriginal-owned mining services company, and recently awarded the crushing and screening contract to Walga Mining at Iron Knob.

Helping break the cycle of disadvantage

Arrium Mining is the major supporter of Foodbank's new School Breakfast Program which launched in Whyalla in late 2014.

The program assists local students who are attending school without having accessed a healthy breakfast – ensuring they have sufficient nourishment to start their school day.

These students are going to school without breakfast for a variety of reasons, and are at a disadvantage from the outset as studies have shown that students concentrate better after eating a healthy breakfast. This lack of concentration can often result in them falling behind in their studies, ultimately increasing the chances of the cycle of disadvantage continuing. By ensuring they have a decent meal to start each day, it helps set them up for success and provides them with a better chance of success at school.

Nine schools have already come on board – including Whyalla High School which serves around 30 breakfasts each morning - and are looking forward to seeing their students benefit from such a worthwhile program.

3.12 **Community Engagement Activities**

3.12.1 **Community consultation**

Arrium Mining continues to have regular contact with key community representatives who provide feedback on mining operations and how these are seen from a community perspective. Regular contact is through:

- phone calls, face-to-face meetings and email exchanges
- regular Environment Consultation Group (ECG) meetings, which are attended by a cross-section of the Whyalla community
- · six-monthly meetings with landholders who are located near Arrium Mining's operations
- regular community forums and open days in Iron Knob



dust forums with interested residents in Whyalla.

3.12.2 **Indigenous consultation**

Arrium Mining meets regularly with the Barngarla community representatives regarding developments in the Indigenous Land Use Agreement (ILUA) area.

The ILUA between OneSteel (Arrium Mining) and the Barngarla Native Title Claimants sets out clear heritage clearance protocols for both parties and includes protocols for notifications concerning proposed changes and developments within the ILUA area.

3.12.3 The Middleback Alliance

The Middleback Alliance is a cooperative framework for sustainable land management across the SMR and surrounding areas.

The Middleback Alliance is directed by three major landholders in the region (Ecological Horizons, Natural Resources Eyre Peninsula (DEWNR) and Arrium Mining).

By sharing resources and cooperatively delivering a works program across land boundaries, the Middleback Alliance delivers improved and sustainable land management outcomes. Achievements for 2014 include:

- removal of 1654 feral goats regionally including 480 from the Middleback Ranges area
- baiting (feral animal control)
- continued monitoring (trapping and micro-chipping) of nationally threatened Sandhill Dunnarts
- survey and monitoring of active mallee fowl nests
- other works included pest plant and animal control and erosion mitigation on Uplands Station and the Ironstone Conservation Park.




Figure 6 Vegetation clearance in the IKMA to October 2014

No tenements in the IKMA are subject to an approval under the Commonwealth Environment Protection and Biodiversity Conservation (EPBC) Act 1999 and therefore no report has been provided to demonstrate compliance with this legislation.



12 AUDITS AND REVIEWS

Arrium Mining was subject to a re-certification audit in 2014 as part of their ISO AS/NZS 14001 certification program (certificate number C10317) with SAI Global (2014). The purpose of the audit was to determine the capability and effectiveness of Arrium Mining's management system in:

- · ensuring continual compliance with customer, statutory and regulatory requirements
- meeting its specified objectives
- conformity of the management system to stated criteria.

SAI Global has recognised that the strength of the Arrium Mining Environmental Management System (EMS) has been the capacity to adapt to changes in the business environment, and that the EMS remains effective and relevant to the needs of the organisation, despite the significant increase in mining activities.

The surveillance audit undertaken in September 2014 included site visits to the IKMA. No non-conformances to the ISO14001 Standard were raised during the audit by SAI Global. Lower level Areas of Concern (AOC) and Opportunities are assigned corrective actions and placed in the Arrium Mining issues management system for tracking and close-out. No findings were made that identified a threat to Arrium Mining's ability to meet the approved environmental outcomes.
