Exploration Licence No. 20 Quarterly Report Period Ending August 2nd. 1973

At the time of writing, an exploratory drilling rig is moving into the area held under Exploration Licence No. 20 and, providing weather permits, a minimum 5,000 foot drilling programme will commence within a few days time.

Access to the area will, to a large extent, dictate the programme to be carried out, but initially two north - south lines of holes are proposed in the vicinity of the western and eastern boundaries of the Licence area respectively.

Expenditure allocated against the Licence to the present time remains unchanged at \$520.

REPORT ON DRILLING E, L. 20 SOUTH AUSTRALIA

SEPTEMBER, 1973



LOCATION AND ACCESS:

E.L. 20 is located approximately 10 miles north of Colona Station and approximately 100 miles west of Ceduna in South Australia. Access is by the main east-west Port Augusta/Kalgoorlie Road to Colona Station, thence by service tracks to the eastern or western boundaries of the Exploration Licence. While the roads are rough, four-wheel drive is not essential on the roadway. However, the country north of the Station is sandy and four-wheel drive is necessary for cross country work.

TOPOGRAPHY AND VEGETATION:

The whole of the area is virtually flat sandy plain. A few small sandhills up to 100 ft. in height are scattered about the Exploration Licence, but are not extensive and can be by-passed without difficulty. Vegetation consists of a few stunted groves of mulga and mallee gum generally over the sand ridges, while the flat plains are spargely grassed along with common desert suculents.

GEOLOGY:

The whole of the Exploration Licence lies within, but on the edge of, the Eucla Basin. Surface geology is recent aeolian sand overlying a Miocene - Eocene succession of limestone and interbedded marine sands. Some lignite is present to the east of the Exploration Licence, apparently associated with old shoreline conditions, but this does not appear to extend into E.L. 20.

DRILLING:

Only two holes were completed - one to 80 ft. using air only and one to 95 ft. using air flush initially, then changing to mud drilling over the last 15 ft. Both holes penetrated the surface sand and entered limestone at 5 ft. This contined to 35 ft. in hole 1 and 70 ft. in hole 2. Both holes then encountered interbedded limestone and fine marine sand to 50 ft. in hole 1 and 80 ft. in hole 2. Both finished in fine yellow to mustard coloured sand.

Drilling could have continued had casing been available, but as this was not, loss of circulation within the fine sands resulted in both holes being abandoned. Logs are attached.

CONCLUSIONS AND RECOMMENDATIONS:

It appears from the surface geology that the limestones extend across the entire area of E.L. 20 and that the same sequence would be encountered on the eastern edge.


There appears little likelihood that the lignite extends within the boundaries of


E.L. 20, or that any sedimentary uranium ores exist.

Further drilling is not warranted. However, if drilling was continued, it is recommended that the drilling be done by air with at least 400 cf/min availability, that casing be used to pass the loose sand zones and that the drill truck be equipped with sand tyres and four-wheel drive.
